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I'm a Youth Leader - What's My Role?

The role of a youth pastor is to simply coach students as they start and lead a P7 Club. As the coach, you are responsible for mentoring and empowering the students and student leaders of the P7 Club.

Here's how you can coach your students:

- Plug in to the local P7 Club. Be familiar with the leadership team at the local P7 Club along with the inner workings of the club.
- Take advantage of the P7 resources that are available to you and the P7 Club.
- Build relationships with the P7 members by hosting events outside of school and inviting the club to.
- Champion the cause of the club in your local church, community and schools.
- Assess the P7 meeting experience if you are present and share your findings with the P7 Club leaders. Be positive as you help them improve their meetings.
- Check in weekly with the P7 Leaders, asking how P7 went, what they taught, and what students you can join them in prayer for.
- Teach the students to RESPECT the club, one another, school administrators and school policy.
- Help the students set healthy expectations early on for the P7 meetings.
- Lead the P7 Club members by example in your daily life.
- Pray daily for your P7 Leaders



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Here's how you can get your students involved with P7:

- Disciple, inspire and persuade your students to unlock their faith in their schools.
- Share testimonies from the P7 website with your students to help them understand they can unlock their faith in school too!
- Use the P7 promotional video during your youth services to generate interest.
- Cast vision that will move your students into action in their local schools. It seems true that you get what you preach. So, preach about the opportunity to change your community by launching Bible Clubs in schools.
- Pray they become burdened for their schools.
- Live a life of making disciples yourself to be the example to students
